Obtaining your student visa from overseas



Can I apply for my visa in the UK?



Can I apply for my visa in the UK?

- You can only apply to extend your student visa in the UK if your course starts within 28 days of your current visa expiry date
- If your current visa expires on or before 25 August 2025 and your course starts on 22 September 2025, you must apply for your next visa from overseas.





When will I receive my CAS?



Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS)

- A CAS is required for a Student visa application.
- If you already have a visa which allows you to study in the UK (e.g., dependant, BNO), you don't need a CAS.
- Your CAS contains information about you and your course of study at the University of Nottingham.
- A 'live' electronic document prepared by the University and held by the Home Office.





When will I get my CAS?

If you have a **conditional offer**, you will not receive your CAS until you have met all the conditions of your offer.

Firmly accept your unconditional offer





CAS verification

- Check CAS information in NottinghamHub.
- Check all information is correct.
- Verify or report any errors.
- Previous UK studies/time limits
- Receive CAS within 5 working days.





What financial evidence do I need?



How much money do I need?



You need to show that you have held the required funds for 28 consecutive days.

You need to show that you can pay for the first year of tuition fees in full and afford your living costs:

living expenses of £1,136 per month for the first nine months of your course (£10,224) – or for the full course duration if it's shorter than nine months.

Financial evidence is extremely important for your visa application, and it's essential to get it right.




Funding methods


- Bank statement (self-funded)
- Financial sponsorship letter (any government, British Council, International organization/company or university **not family/friends**)
- Evidence of a student loan
- Differential evidence requirement: www.gov.uk/student- visa/money

PLEASE TURN OVER

The funds you need to show for your application must be in your account for a consecutive 28 day period. The balance should not drop below the required funds during that period. The end date of the 28 day period must be within 31 days of the date you submit your visa application

What documents do I need for a Student visa?



Documents you may need to submit

- Passport
- Financial evidence
- Official translations of any evidence that isn't in English
- ATAS certificate (certain courses only)
- TB test certificate (if applicable) www.gov.uk/tb-test-visa
- Qualification evidence not usually required if your course is at degree level or above



- Apply online + pay fees
- Book a visa appointment –
 give biometric information, passport
- Find a visa application centre www.gov.uk/find-a-visa-applicationcentre
- Wait to receive a decision –
 processing times do vary standard
 time is 15 working days. There are
 no guarantees with processing
 times.






Receiving your visa

- Most will receive a vignette visa (sticker) in your passport that will be valid for 90 days to allow you to travel to the UK. You must enter the UK during this 90 day validity period to activate your Student visa.*Note - vignettes are being phased out from July 2025
- If your course is **longer than 6 months**, your full visa will be accessible via an eVisa. You won't get a physical copy of your full visa, but it will be held in an online immigration record called an 'eVisa'.







Accessing your eVisa

- When you get your visa decision email you will receive instructions on how to link your UKVI account to your eVisa.
- You will need access to a smartphone which is compatible with the <u>UK Immigration</u>: <u>ID Check App</u> to confirm your identity.
- You will be able to share your immigration status online and also generate a share code which you must provide to the University.





Getting ready for registration

- Please provide your share code prior to registration (and prior to arrival in the UK) via a <u>Digital Visa Status MS Form</u>.
- You will need to be logged onto your University email account in order to access the above MS Form. You can register for your University IT account up to 4 weeks before your course start date.
- Sharecodes and visa decision letters / letter can also be emailed to <u>immigration-support@nottingham.ac.uk</u> with your Nottingham Student ID number.
- Instructions are available via the In-Person Registration web pages <u>https://www.nottingham.ac.uk/studentservices/servicedetails/registration/in-person-registration.aspx</u>
- You will then show your passport, vignette sticker and evidence of your date of arrival in the UK in-person once you are at the University. This must be completed within 3 weeks of your course start date.



How can I avoid a visa refusal?



Avoiding a visa refusal

Top tips for a successful visa application:



- make sure you know the level of funds you are required to show
- show the necessary funds have been held by you or your parents* for at least 28 days in a registered financial institution
- show that the 28 day rule is met very clearly either a bank letter stating this or a transaction history showing that the money has not dipped below the required level, even for one day
- make sure that your financial evidence is recent, showing a last transaction dated no more than
 31 days ago, at the time you apply for the visa online
- * You cannot use bank statements of other family members (such as aunt, uncle, brother or sister).

If your visa has been refused, the reasons will be stated in the decision letter. Contact our Visa & Immigration team immediately and include a copy of the decision letter. We can advise you on whether you should appeal this decision or make a new application, which will require a new CAS from us.
